Traffic Alert for Area Roads

Chipley – Drivers are reminded to practice caution while traveling in and around work zones in Northwest Florida.

Bay County:

- **State Road (S.R.) 30 (U.S. 98) at S.R. 368 (23rd Street)**– Drivers will encounter intermittent road closures on 23rd Street near temporary U.S. 98 from 12 a.m. to 5 a.m. on Tuesday, Jan. 16 and Wednesday, Jan. 17. The closures are necessary for workers to set steel tub girder beams east of 23rd Street.
- **S.R. 390 from Baldwin Road to Jenks Avenue** – Utility relocations continue along the corridor, excavation for stormwater retention pond work is ongoing near the Department of Corrections facility and Jenks Avenue. No lane closures or traffic impacts anticipated.
- Paving work continues on **U.S. 98 from the main gate at Tyndall AFB to the Mexico Beach city limits**. Watch for construction equipment and workers.
- Construction on **S.R. 391 (Airport Road) from Harrison Avenue to south of Fortune Avenue** will begin soon.
- **U.S. 98 at Cauley Avenue** – Workers are paving near the intersection, there will be daytime impacts to traffic.
- **U.S. 98 Dupont Bridge** – A routine inspection of the structure will take place, Tuesday, Jan. 16. Driver will encounter alternating east and westbound lane closures from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Jackson County:

- **I-10 from east of County Road (C.R.) 69A to the Gadsden County line**– Construction signage is installed and work is underway. Minimal traffic impacts can be expected at this time.
- **S.R. 276 at C.R. 10A (Old Cottondale Highway)** – Curb work is taking place near the intersection. Paving will follow curb work. Drivers are reminded that crews work 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

All planned construction activities are weather dependent and may be delayed or rescheduled in the event of inclement weather. Motorists are reminded to pay attention to the speed limit when traveling through the construction area, to watch for construction equipment entering and leaving the roadway, and to use caution when driving through the workzone. Speeding fines double when workers are present.
